You can <u>read more about these here.</u> There are a mixture of in person courses, online courses, part time courses, full time courses and different levels! You can use the filters on the UCAS website to make the search more relevant to you.



University isn't right for everyone. Maybe you're considering doing an apprenticeship in the future instead. Here is more information form UCAS in the format of an <u>industry guide</u> which provides you with average salaries, case studies and videos about digital apprenticeships.



At the time of writing this newsletter, there are <u>270</u> <u>apprenticeship vacancies</u> currently being advertised on the UCAS website. Like with the university search, you will need to use the filters to personalise this search to you.



UCAS isn't the only place you can find information on apprenticeships, you can also use; <u>Not Going to Uni</u>, <u>Get my First</u> <u>Job</u> and the <u>Government website</u>. Each website will have different opportunities.



If there is a particular company you're interested in working for, you can also look at their specific apprenticeship information. To do this, search the name of the company followed by "early careers". This will also tell you about graduate schemes if you're thinking of joining the workplace after university. Here are some examples; <u>Google, Microsoft, Amazon</u>



Don't wait to learn about AI! You can complete a <u>free Google</u> <u>Certification</u> now. This will look great on your applications for university or apprenticeships in the future.
