Welcome to A-Level English Literature - you are about to embark on a most rewarding and challenging two years. In order to provide you with a sound introduction to the rigours and delights of the advanced study of literature, we have devised a reading list that reflects the level of reading you will need to demonstrate both in set text reading and independent Non-Examination reading.

Set Text Reading List Year 12 In Term 1 and 2, you will read the following texts: *Othello*, William Shakespeare Keats Poetry, Keats (AQA Anthology: You will be provided with a copy of this free of charge.) Term 3 and 4: Death of a Salesman, Arthur Miller The World's Wife, Carol Anne Duffy (for use with NEA Poetry task) Term 5 and 6: The Handmaid's Tale, Margaret Attwood Prose text of your choice (approved by teacher) for use with NEA Prose task. Year 13 In Term 1 and 2, you will read the following texts: Songs of Innocence and Experience, William Blake (AQA Anthology: You will be provided with a copy of this free of charge.) The Kite Runner, Khaled Husseini

The Critical Anthology: AQA also produce an anthology of critical readings of literature divided into 6 sections:

- narrative theory
- feminist theory
- Marxist theory
- eco-critical theory
- post-colonial theory
- literary value and the canon.

**REMEMBER -** The study of English Literature is all about the love of books and reading. Obviously, any student who does not love reading, should think carefully before taking this course. In order to facilitate and guide your love of reading, we have produced an extensive reading list for you to use throughout the two year course. The list includes 'canonical' literature and modern/contemporary literature. These lists are of particular importance for anyone who is considering studying English Literature or a related subject at university as experience has taught us that most of the top universities will not offer a place to students who cannot prove engagement beyond set texts. The lists are not exhaustive- there is of course a wealth of good literature in the world- but they can act as a starting point for wider reading.
