Our Aims

We endeavour to foster interest and success in MFL for all. Students are encouraged to reach their full potential and to develop skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking.

Department Information

The MFL department currently consists of three members of staff. Situated on the second floor, lessons are taught in 3 dedicated classrooms.

Each classroom is fitted with a data projector and fully interactive whiteboards.

Key Stage 3 French

At North Oxfordshire Academy the aim is to make the study of French enjoyable and relevant for all pupils. When pupils enter the school in Year 7, they are put into ability groups and setting is used through the remainder of Key Stage 3.

The syllabus is led by the New National Curriculum. Pupils are taught to develop their skills in reading, listening, writing and speaking over a broad range of topics. The emphasis is on using correct grammar to communicate effectively in a variety of contexts and to develop an appreciation for media in the target language. Pupils are encouraged to use their own initiative and imagination when tackling a variety of tasks.

Home Learning- All parents are encouraged to support their child by checking Show My Homework and staff within the faculty set homework regularly for students using this resource.

The department sets one vocabulary and spelling test a week. Homework is assessed in line with the department and school policies and makes use of the RAG system and diagnostic feedback. Students

are required to comment on the written homework pieces and set targets to improve. This will be available in the school planner for parents to review.

Key Stage 4- French and Spanish

GCSE French or Spanish is an important qualification that is always in demand in both the employment markets and as a foundation for further study. The ability to communicate in a second language is a quality which is greatly desired. Our students appreciate the emphasis that their future employers place on language learning, even if they will not directly require it in their preferred career and for this reason alone it remains a highly popular GCSE.

At North Oxfordshire Academy we aim to develop a positive attitude towards the subject and an appreciation of its numerous roles. These aims will be achieved through teaching and learning strategies which are enjoyable but nevertheless require **hard work and resilience**.

Currently, our students study a 3 year GCSE course and we follow the **AQA** syllabus. The course in Year 11 is 60% Controlled Assessment and 40% final exams. For the Controlled Assessment, students

need to complete 2 pieces of writing (30% in total, 15% per piece of work) and 2 speaking exams (30% in total, 15% per speaking exam). The reading and listening exams will take place at the end of year 11 and students will either sit higher tier or Foundation tier depending on their individual needs. For Year 10 and Year 9 the course is 100% final exams (25% speaking, 25% writing, 25% listening and 25% reading).

MFL Key Stage 5

For both languages, at AS level you will study 4 modules: Media, Popular Culture, Healthy Living and Family and Relationship. The exam is based on 75% reading, listening and writing and 25% speaking. At A2, you will study 5 modules: Environment, Multicultural Society and Contemporary Social Issues as well as 2 cultural modules which you can agree on with your teacher.

Home Learning & Independent Study Expectations

Students will be given approximately 3 hours of Home Learning per week which is focused on developing exam skills, broadening their range of vocabulary and strengthening their grammar knowledge and skills. This will be recorded on Show My Homework.
