A Policy Statement on Provider Access

North Oxfordshire Academy: Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student entitlement

All students in Years 8-11 are entitled to:

- find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point
- hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through curriculum evenings, assemblies, group discussions and taster events.
- understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Management of provider access requests

Providers will be granted access based on locality, time of year and to fit around curriculum assessment and exams.
