North Oxfordshire Academy Sixth Form 16-19 Tuition Fund Statement

Small Group Tuition Funding

The Department of Education announced funding to support students whose learning was disrupted as a result of the COVID pandemic. This 16-19 Tuition Fund is available to all 16 to 19 providers such as North Oxfordshire Academy and is ring-fenced for 16 to 19 small group tuition only.

The funding can be used to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted. The guidance indicates that the supported students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme and who have not achieved grade 5 or above in GCSE maths and/or English by age 16. All will be on a 16 to 19 study programme.

The subjects covered in the tuition will not be limited to English and maths but will be identified according to need and existing programmes.

North Oxfordshire Academy commits to using the small group tuition funding that it has been given to mitigate against the impact of the pandemic on our study programme students. Sessions will be limited to three to five students per group and will be above and beyond normal timetabled hours. Students will be prioritised for small group tuition based on the guidance released by the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA).

Support sessions will be prioritised for the following students:

- Those with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan/SEN
- Those who have a grade 4 or below in GCSE Maths and/or English
- Students where learning was disrupted last year due to COVID 19 (isolating, shielding or contracted the virus)

Examples of some of the Tuition Support on offer will include:

- GCSE exam re-sit preparation (materials and books)
- One to one student support sessions each week with study supervisor for English GCSE re-take students
- Access to UpLearn for our A Level Psychology students (online)
- Access to Hegarty maths online for Maths GCSE re-take students
- Interventions during tutor time for A Level Biology, History, Psychology, Chemistry and English with experienced KS5 teachers at NOA
- After school revision and catch up sessions for A Level Biology students every Wednesday by Ms Wickham (Biology teacher)

Examples of some of the pastoral support on offer will include:

- Pastoral teaching support (Oxbridge mentoring) for disadvantaged pupils with a member of the sixth form team (Dr O'Hear, Ms Thorne and Ms Hall) – LNAT, BMAT and UCAT preparation
- Admission testing for TA assessments (Oxford University)

Tuition Support offered will be based on individual needs, the identification of an individual starting point, clear learning goals and expectations and outcomes. This may include a mix of both teaching and learning support staff as appropriate. Our commitment
